




# HOME FAMILY BIBLE STUDY



**TIP:** Remember to begin and end with prayer, as well as plant your seed offering. It may be helpful to have someone read the scriptures in the King James Version (KJV) and another the Amplified (AMP) version for better understanding.

**Date:** November 25, 2020

**Topic:** **Every Day Is A Day of Thanksgiving**  
*"O give thanks unto the Lord; for He is good!" Psalm 136*

**Introduction:** Lately, if you listen to most people you will hear some sort of complaint. Unfortunately, with so much going on, it is easy to identify all the bad things happening. While it is evident that this year has been incredibly challenging and difficult for many people, as Christians, we must be careful not to join the **2020 "bad" wagon** which is full of complaints, murmurs, and displeasures. Instead of counting all the bad things, we should be counting our blessings and thanking God for them every day!

**Read:** **Ephesians 5:20, Psalm 118:21, Psalm 28:7**



**Discuss:** **Ephesians 5:20** says to give thanks *always* and *for everything*. This means that giving thanks is not conditional or seasonal. What are 3 obvious things in your life that you are thankful for and what are 3 "not-so-obvious" things that you are thankful for? Choose 1 out of the 6 things and discuss *why* you are thankful for it.

In **Psalm 118:21** the psalmist thanked God for being His salvation. For a Christian, salvation is a beautiful gift of love to you from God. Because salvation is a gift that you only need to receive once, do you remember to thank God for it every day? What other gifts do you receive because of salvation? Discuss.

In **Psalm 28:7** the psalmist recalls what led him to thank God with a song. If you could choose one song to express your heart of thanksgiving to the Lord, what would it be and why? (\*Do not forget to sing it to Him whenever you get an opportunity.)



**Search:** **Give Thanks** **Psalm 103:1-5, Psalm 9:1, Colossians 2:6-7**



**Conclusion:** The traditional American Thanksgiving holiday is a seasonal time intended for one to gather with family and friends in a spirit of thankfulness. While this act of gathering may be good, the Bible makes it clear that giving thanks to God is not seasonal. It should be a natural occurrence 365 days a year! Unlike many people today who are in short supply of thanks, as a

believer, you do not have to worry because your well of thanks will never run dry. In fact, according to Colossians 2:7, "...you will overflow with thankfulness!" Therefore, no matter who decides to join the **2020 "bad" wagon**, with God in control, you can remain on the triumphant train of thanksgiving today and always!
