

Date: June 16, 2021

Topic: What Are You Saying?

Introduction: We are powerful creative beings in the earth, made in the image and likeness of our Father, the creator of the universe. Because of this, we have the unique ability to speak things into existence that do not exist. Ephesians 5:1, says that we should be imitators of God, just as children imitate their parents. Therefore, to see darkness turn to light, death to life, and brokenness to wholeness, we must speak like He spoke! However, many believers have yet to grasp the fullness of this powerful ability they possess. Instead of having what they say, they are saying what they have (example: I don't have any money...I have diabetes)! Mark 11:23 says, *For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not doubt in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; **he shall have whatsoever he saith.*** This is not a theory; this is Biblical truth! Therefore, tonight your assignment is to examine the words you are speaking, reclaim your identity in Christ, and start speaking and declaring all that God has for your life!

Discuss:

Examine Your Words

The book of Genesis reveals the beginning all of creation using words. "And God **said**, Let there be..." (Genesis 1:1-3). From the onset, we learn that words are powerful (John 1:1-4). As a result, each day after God finished, He observed what He spoke into existence and called it "good." On the sixth day, God finished His work of creation looked back at what He made, took it all in and said it was "very good."

Read the **first three words** of Genesis 1:3, 1:5, 1:6, 1:8,1:9, 1:10, & 1:11.

These three words lets you know that God _____ it before He saw it. Everything that was made, is a result of words that were spoken.

Take a moment to examine your life and your physical surroundings. How often do you stop and look around to see what your words have or have not created? Can you say that everything is “good?” Is your life a reflection of what you wanted it to be? If not, what have you been saying about it?

Reclaim Your Identity

Among God’s creation, was man. However, unlike anything else they (“...Let *us* make man”) created, man reflected their image. With this in mind, God “blessed” man and gave him dominion over all the earth (Genesis 1:26-28). This gave man power and authority! “We having the same spirit of faith, according as it is written, I believed, and therefore have I spoken; we also believe, and therefore speak” (2 Corinthians 4:13). In addition, Psalm 115:16 says that “The heaven, even the heavens, are the Lord's: but the earth hath he given to the children of men.” Then, John 15:7 says, “If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you.”

Know who you are and whose you are. **YOU ARE A SON OF THE CREATOR OF THE UNIVERSE** (“But as many as received him, to them gave He power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name”). You have the same innate creative abilities that your Father used in Genesis and throughout the scriptures. **Therefore, your words are powerful because you possess the creative power as child of God.** Reclaim your identity!

Speak and Declare It

Remember, that Mark 11:23 says that “You will have whatever you say.” You should no longer speak what you see, but according to the word, you were given the power to speak what you want it to be! If you need something in your life changed...change the way you speak about it! As a child of God, always remember that you have the same spirit of faith to *call those things that are not, as though they were* (Romans 4:17).



Conclusion

Take a moment to reflect on what you have been saying about your life. If you were speaking negatively, it is time for change! From this night forward, choose your words wisely. Because you are a child of God, remember that **ALL** words that you speak are powerful; be it negative or positive. Think before you speak (James 1:19)! Use your words to create the world that you desire and not anything less. *What are you saying?*
